



# **CEFR LP SIG Results on Voting in November 2022**




CEFR & LP SIG Motion 2022-1: Do you approve moving to online voting for JALT CEFR & LP SIG affairs?

# Let's finish on a positive note. While this year has been difficult for many of us, we have all risen to the challenge. What has been a positive JALT experience for you this year? Additionally, what changed this year that your SIG will continue to use/ invest in/ work on in the future?

2022 was a good, productive, very busy year. We focused in 2022 on the Portfolio for events because it was neglected in the other years before and there are coming guite some people from other SIGs in JALT as well to the Roundtable. 2022 is the third year of our JSPS Kaken project 20K00759, the fourth research project of the SIG in a row. We are about to pull the project together. The outcome of the project will become another book publication with Springer (to be submitted in 2023, we have already the contract). This will become the 5th book publication including the name of the SIG and the name of JALT; 3 books so far where outcome of former research projects, one volume was done by the SIG in 2010 with support from JALT. The researcher/authors of the new edited volume are all JALT members and most of them CEFR & LP SIG members and part of the research project. JALT is a vital part of the activities of CEFR & LP SIG, and I hope the SIG contributes to JALT. And there is an impact beyond, the CEFR Journal. We collaborate with international experts for reviewing. The Journal is already established in the international CEFR community. One more place where the name of JALT is known, inside and outside of Japan. And we support our members on an individual basis.
